Local community members learn and raise awareness of sustainable management of the dry forest in Talara



A key driver in deforestation of the endangered dry forests is illegal logging of the algarrobo tree (*Prosopis sp.*) to be used as firewood. To tackle the underlying cause of deforestation, A Rocha Peru works directly with local communities to promote their sustainable management of their forests with technical training of sustainable income-generating activities and the importance of the harmony between the local populations and their forests.

In Talara, A Rocha Peru organised a fair in the main square of Talara entitled "My Dry Forest". In the fair, desserts made from sustainable products of the dry forest, such as algarrobina, a syrup made from the

The next generation of environmental leaders are being trained in innovation in the Esperanza Peace Centre



In the Esperanza Peace Centre Project, we are training the next generation of environmental leaders in technical trainings provided by the A Rocha Peru team. In November, a total of 14 children were trained in an automated irrigation system. This followed the hard work of the children in the Esperanza Peace Centre who participated in preparing the land, sewing plants, and constructing the structure which would be used for the irrigation system. The plants were a generation donation from the local company Viveros Agrogenesis S.A

Local environmental leaders from Talara participate in a knowledge exchange trip



In September, the first knowledge exchange trip was carried out with 9 local leaders from our Talara project. The objective of the exchange was to share and enrich the knowledge which the leaders have learnt through their experiences of working to restore the dry forest in Talara. The leaders travelled to La Libertad department, to the dry forest of "El Cañoncillo" which are also affected by the same drivers of deforestation, such as illegal



In October, A Rocha Peru collaborated in the international "Renew Our World" campaign headed by the organisation Tear Fund. The campaign had the objective of raising awareness of Christian principles behind environmental stewardship, and the need to take action to save the environment. At a local level, the campaign included the alliance between local NGOs such as Paz y Esperanza, A Rocha Peru, Vida Abundante and the national network of evangelical students (AGEUP). The campaign included the event "Conference for a New World" in the Centro Cultural de la Biblia in Lima and the "Plant a Tree for a New World" in Trujillo, with the participation of the beneficiaries from the Esperanza Peace Centre Project.

Forest Congress in Talara



On the 9th and 10th November, the first Forest Congress was held at the Universidad Nacional de Piura. At the event, the issues that dry forests conservation and the lessons learnt from the Talara project were discussed by the A Rocha Peru team. Moreover, there was a discussion on the social, economic and environmental impacts of the dry forest conservation. A variety of institutions and universities participated in the Forest Congress, including the Asociación para la Investigación y Desarrollo Integral (AIDER), the Servicio Forestal y de Fauna Silvestre (SERFOR) and the Universidad de Nacional de Piura.

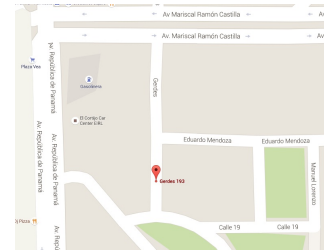
We are very grateful to have received a generous donation from the Emelco Foundation to support the Esperanza Peace Centre Project that will allow us to continue the important work in 2018.
