Successful delivery of the Dry Forest Project's second year



A Rocha Peru has completed its second year of the Dry Forest Conservation project in Pacasmayo, La Libertad, Peru. For 2019, this project was delivered in partnership with A Rocha International, with the support of the Swiss Foundation, Interaction, Watersheds Foundation and individual donors.

We are delighted to communicate that the project has made significant progress in achieving its goal to collaborate with local communities to restore, conserve, and sustainably manage dry forest landscapes for the benefit of nature and society in northern Peru. Key highlights include:

Strategic Planning Day, Peru


